





Hurricane Ida July 28, 2021 11:00am

Mb- 985 mb
Storm Surge- 9 ft.
Movement- NW 16 mph
Size- 30 miles deep
Rainfall 10" in 24hrs
Wind speed 85 mph

In the past 24 hours the storm got stronger in mb/wind speed, smaller in size, is moving faster & has more storm surge

This storm is going to be primarily a wind event with the worst on Sunday between 5pm-9pm

Mayor's Critical Information Requirements


- 1. Any Tropical Depression or Storm that enters or develops in the Caribbean Sea, the Southern Atlantic Ocean, or the Gulf of Mexico August 26, 2021
- 2. Significant changes in Storm intensity & projected H-Hour (*Tropical Storm winds on Louisiana coast*) Tropical storm winds along the Louisiana coast projected on August 29, 2021
- 3. Regional Parish, State & Federal Declarations of Emergency in Louisiana or any adjacent Gulf Coast State
 - Governor declared a state of emergency on August 26, 2021
 - Lafourche Parish declared a state of emergency on August 27, 2021
 - Federal Presidential Pre-Land Fall Declaration requested on August 27, 2021
- 4. Any loss or significant degradation of any communication system used by Emergency Management Officials None
- 5. Any evacuation orders by Local Officials Lafourche/Terrebonne/St. Mary
- 6. Any major issues raised by Parish Presidents or Mayors in potential effected areas Storm Effects in All Bayou/River Parishes
- 7. Any changes to the manning level of the State EOC State EOC 24/7 on August 27, 2021


Situational Summary- Saturday August 28, 2021

- 1. The City of Thibodaux (COT) has monitored this event for the past 72 hours (H-96 to H-24) and the Mayor activated the unified command group at H-72 (August 26, 2021 2:00pm)
- 2. The COT continues to be involved in parish, state and federal conference calls for this storm
- 3. The COT conducted a UCG on August 28, 2021, issued PSA 2 at H-42 (August 28, 2021 11:00am), published the UCG situational briefing to the emergency alert group, and will conduct another UCG session on August 29, 2021 at 9:00am.
- 4. The COT Police Department will implement a curfew from Saturday at 6pm until further notice. This is support of a Parish wide curfew of the same time/duration.
- 5. COT essential workers are currently in storm preparation and will transition to the rescue phase of this storm when the curfew takes effect.
- 6. The TVFD conducted a leadership meeting yesterday and continues with the storm emergency response plan.
- 7. The COT TVFD and Emergency Preparedness Director coordinated with FEMA for the establishment of a regional first responder camp to support recovery operations post storm (Andolsek Park)

Lafourche Parish Situation

- 1. Lafourche Parish Declaration on August 27, 2021
- 2. EOC Operations is at full staffing
- 3. Mandatory evacuation for the parish
- 4. Shelter operations start at Central Lafourche and Thibodaux High start on Saturday, August 28, 2021 at 12pm
- 5. Curfew starting Saturday, 6pm until further notice





COT Incident Action Plan-August 28, 2021 Next 24 Hours

- The COT will continue to monitor the event and make a decisions through the COT's Unified Command Group (UCG).
- 2. The COT will issue a PSA after the series of conference calls today, August 28, 2021.
- A curfew will be in place Saturday night at 6pm until further notice.
- 4. The priority of work for the next 24 hours is storm preparation, tracking and dissemination of information to the public.
- 5. COT essential workers will focus on the rescue phase of this storm in the next 24 hours and will not transition to recovery until storm winds drop below 30 mph.
