The City Council of the City of Thibodaux assembled in regular session at its regular meeting place, City Hall, 310 West 2<sup>nd</sup> Street, Thibodaux, Louisiana, on Tuesday, July 15, 2025 at 5:00 P.M.

On motion of Councilwoman Crochet, seconded by Councilman Richard, the Council voted to adopt the minutes of the July 1, 2025 City Council Meeting as written. Upon roll call the vote was as follows:

In accordance with the prescribed statewide agreed-upon procedures by the Legislative Auditor, the Finance Director has submitted the monthly revenue and expense report for June 2025 to the City Council for review.

The City has been notified by their auditors that in accordance with the prescribed statewide agreed-upon procedures by the Legislative Auditor, the Finance Director has to submit updates to the City Council concerning the resolutions being made to the findings included in the FY 2024 Audit Report according to management's Corrective Action Plan until all items have been resolved.

The Finance Director prepared a corrective action plan with regard to the finding dealing with public bid law, and presented it to the Council for their review.

DOTD has submitted Change Orders No. 1, 2, & 3 for the Audubon Avenue Overlay Project to the City for approval.

Change Order No. 1 includes additional patching on LA1 requested by the City, and ADA ramp work changes, and increases the contract by \$73,097.79. Change Order No. 2 changes the scope of work for the project to include the area of Audubon Ave. that is in Terrebonne Parish to be included in the project, and increases the contract by \$75,931.83. Change Order No. 3 is added in order to compensate the contractor for the Owners and Contractors Protective (OCP) Liability Insurance, and increases the contract by \$2,130.00. The total off all change orders increases the contract by \$151,159.62; thereby making the total contract amount \$1,706,755.27.

On motion of Councilman Taylor, seconded by Councilman Richard, the Council voted on a resolution to approve Change Orders No. 1, 2, and 3 with Huey P. Stockstill, LLC for LADOTD Project H.013269.6 Audubon Avenue Overlay LA 1 to Terrebonne Parish Line and authorizing the execution of the documents therewith. Upon roll call the vote was as follows:

# A RESOLUTION APPROVING CHANGE ORDERS NO. 1, 2 AND 3 WITH HUEY P. STOCKSTILL, LLC FOR LADOTD PROJECT H.013269.6 AUDUBON AVENUE OVERLAY LA 1 TO TERREBONNE PARISH LINE AND AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF THE DOCUMENTS THEREWITH

*BE IT RESOLVED* by the City Council of the City of Thibodaux in regular session assembled, that:

*WHEREAS*, the City entered into a contract with Huey P. Stockstill, LLC for the Audubon Avenue Overlay Project which is LA DOTD Project No. H.0132690.6; and

WHEREAS, due to additional work requested to patch areas on LA 1, changes to the ADA ramp needs, change in the scope of work to include the portion of Audubon Avenue that is in Terrebonne Parish, and to compensate the contractor for the Owners and Contractors Protective (OCP) Liability Insurance cost, Change Orders No. 1, 2 and 3 are being proposed; and

*WHEREAS*, Change Order No. 1 increases the contract amount by \$73,097.79, Change Order No. 2 increases the contract amount by \$75,931.83, and Change Order No. 3 increases the contract amount by \$2,130.00; thereby making the total contract amount \$1,706,755.27.

*NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED* by the City Council of the City of Thibodaux that Change Orders No. 1, 2 and with Huey P. Stockstill, LLC, as mentioned above, are hereby approved, and authorize the execution of the related documents on behalf of the City.

The Public Hearing on this ordinance will be held at the Council meeting on August 5, 2025. Councilman Taylor introduced an ordinance which sets forth the General Alimony, Streets, Roads & Alleys, Fire Department, and Fire Protection Facilities "Adjusted" Millage Rates and Roll Forward to Millage Rates not exceeding the "Maximum" Authorized Rates in the City of Thibodaux for 2025 Tax Year. The Public Hearing on this ordinance will be held at the Council meeting on August 5, 2025.

Councilwoman Crochet introduced an ordinance to approve a special exception request in accordance with Section 307 of the Thibodaux Zoning Ordinance in order to allow a manufactured home in an R-4 Zoning District – 1355 Ledet Street. The Public Hearing on this ordinance will be held at the Council meeting on August 19, 2025.

Councilman Richard introduced an ordinance to approve a special exception request in accordance with Section 307 of the Thibodaux Zoning Ordinance in order to allow a personal services establishment in an R-3 Zoning District - 817-A Jackson Street (hair salon). The Public Hearing on this ordinance will be held at the Council meeting on August 19, 2025.

The Finance Director has prepared Budget Amendment I to the 2025 Budget for the mid-year adjustments.

The proposed adjustments are being made to update budgeted numbers that were estimated during the budget approval process, and to add new projects that were not included in the budget. The Mayor has certified that the additional funds are available for appropriation.

# AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 3381 "APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE FOR THE YEAR 2025"-SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATION I (MID-YEAR)

AN ORDINANCE APPROVING A SPECIAL EXCEPTION REQUEST IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 307 OF THE THIBODAUX ZONING ORDINANCE IN ORDER TO ALLOW A MANUFACTURED HOME IN AN R-4 ZONING DISTRICT – 1349 LEDET STREET

**BE IT ORDAINED** by the City Council of the City of Thibodaux in regular session assembled, that:

WHEREAS, in accordance with the provisions of Section 307 of the Thibodaux Zoning Ordinance, a special exception request has been filed with the Zoning Administrator by Perry Brown for property located at 1349 Ledet Street which is designated as an R-4 Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, the request was filed in order to request a special exception in accordance with the R-4 Zoning District regulations in order to allow a manufactured home at this location; and

*WHEREAS*, a request for a special exception was duly referred to the Thibodaux Planning and Zoning Commission on June 4, 2025 and the Commission is recommending approval of the request by the City Council.

#### ORDINANCE NO. 3397

# AN ORDINANCE DECLARING A STATE OF EMERGENCY IN THE CITY OF THIBODAUX IN CONJUNCTION WITH POTENTIAL TROPICAL SYSTEM INVEST 93L

*BE IT ORDAINED* by the City Council of the City of Thibodaux in special session assembled, that:

WHEREAS, the National Weather Service is tracking the potential tropical system known now as Invest 93L that is expected to impact the coastal parishes of Louisiana with heavy rains and potential flooding beginning on or about July 16, 2025 and lasting several days; and

WHEREAS, the forecast from the National Weather Service indicates that the City of Thibodaux may be subjected to hazardous weather conditions to such a degree that life and property may be placed in jeopardy; and *NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED* that the City Council of the City of Thibodaux does hereby declare the situation in the City of Thibodaux relative to Invest 93L an emergency in conjunction with the provisions of Article V, Section 4 of the Thibodaux City Charter.

**BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED** that the Mayor is hereby authorized to execute any and all service contracts required in order to address the cleanup and recovery efforts of the City relative to the damages caused by this storm.

*BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED* that public bid requirements relative to this emergency shall be waived in accordance with the provisions of LRS 38:2212 (P) and LRS 38:2212.1 (K).

*BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED* that the provisions of this ordinance shall be in effect from the date of declaration, and shall remain in full force and effect for a period of thirty (30) days from that date.

- The Downtown Pavilion should be complete in the next 2-3 weeks.
