In accordance with the prescribed statewide agreed-upon procedures by the Legislative Auditor, the Finance Director has submitted the monthly revenue and expense report for May 2026 to the city council for review.

Freddy Smith and Suzanne Giroir of EisnerAmper presented the City's 2025 audit results. The auditors reported an unmodified opinion on the City's financial statements and federal compliance audit, with no findings or instances of noncompliance noted. Financial highlights, audit adjustments, and management letter recommendations were reviewed with the Council.

Ana Gale-Orellana and Justin Blanchard of Entergy Louisiana provided an update on the company's resiliency program and planned infrastructure improvements within the City of Thibodaux. The presentation included an overview of system hardening efforts, pole replacement projects, and upcoming downtown resiliency work. Entergy reported approximately \$29 million in resiliency investments within the City and discussed planned construction schedules and customer notification procedures.

Councilman Taylor introduced an ordinance approving the final plat for the re-division of Lot 120 of the Grinnage Plan for the City of Thibodaux into Tract NPH-1 and Tract NPH-2 located on President Street as approved by the Planning and Zoning Commission at their June 3, 2026 meeting. The public hearing for this ordinance will be held on July 7th, 2026.

Councilman Mire introduced a zoning ordinance to amend and re-enact Section 506, Table 5.3 of the Thibodaux Zoning Ordinance – Commercial District Uses and Special Exceptions-Pet Care Facility as Permitted in C-1 and C-2 Districts. The public hearing for this ordinance will be held on July 7th, 2026.

Councilman Harang introduced a zoning ordinance to amend and re-enact Section 704 (A), Table 7.1 of the Thibodaux Zoning Ordinance – Event Venue Off-Street Vehicle Parking Requirements. The public hearing for this ordinance will be held on July 7th, 2026.

Raecheal Vizier, 820 Jackson Street, expressed concerns regarding parking restrictions on Jackson Street and their impact on area residents and businesses. Ms. Vizier stated that she had been contacted by the Police Department regarding on-street parking and expressed concerns regarding the impact of parking restrictions on nearby residents and businesses. Councilman Naquin clarified that the Council had not voted to prohibit parking on Jackson Street and explained that Jackson Street is a state highway, where parking regulations are governed by state law.

Mayor Clement invited Ms. Vizier to contact his office to discuss her concerns further and explore potential solutions.

The Mayor informed the Council of issues and projects going on throughout the City:

- **Public Works has been hard at work cleaning drains. He explained that the City regularly utilizes its Vac Truck to do this work.**
- **He congratulated the finance director and her team for a job well done with the Audit.**
- **Saturday, June 20, from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., there will be a Juneteenth Celebration at MLK Park.**

Councilman Harang requested an update on the Canal Blvd Bridge Project meetings and Mayor Clement shared that they have been going over plans and he is currently working on putting together a report to share with Council.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 6:27 P.M.
